Established in September 2000, the Gordon and Betty Moore Foundation is dedicated to advancing environmental conservation, scientific research, and patient care, as well as helping to improve the quality of life in the San Francisco Bay Area–Gordon and Betty Moore's home for more than 70 years.

The Foundation is devoted to the inspirational vision articulated by our founders, "creating positive outcomes for future generations." A set of core values—impact, integrity, disciplined approach, and collaboration—direct the Foundation's our work.

Our Founders

In 1965, Gordon Moore made a rule-of-thumb prediction, later dubbed "Moore's Law," that has become a guiding principle for the delivery of ever more powerful semiconductor chips at proportionally lower costs. Today, this standard continues to set the pace of technology development and progress. Gordon has been committed to technological progress throughout his career as a leader in the new semiconductor industry, first as co-founder of Fairchild Semiconductor, and then as co-founder of Intel Corporation.

Betty met Gordon at San Jose State College where she received her bachelor's degree in Journalism in 1949. Gordon and Betty were married the following year. While Gordon attended graduate school at the California Institute of Technology in Pasadena, Betty worked for Consolidated Engineering Corporation in advertising and public relations before joining the Ford Foundation.

By establishing the Gordon and Betty Moore Foundation together in 2000, the Moores' philanthropic contributions build on the work they have dedicated to science, the environment, and patient care for decades, both at home and abroad.
